

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

### CONSTITUTION

From a long seees of experience, we, the churches of lesus Carist, being regularly bastized oon our profession of faith in Jesus Christ, are winced of the ne essity of a combination of rches, in order to perpetuate a union and comaion among us, and preserve; maintain and keep rules and orders of an association, according the following plan or form of government:

ARTICLE 1 The association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches, and only sent to represent in the association who shall be members whom they shall think qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches certifying their appointment shall be entitled to a seat.

ART. 2 In the letters from the different churches shall be appressed their number in full fellowship, their potized, received by letter, restored, dismissed, excommunicated and dead, since the last association.

ART. 3 The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's eritage, nor shall they have any clerical power er the churches, nor shall they infringe on the ernal rights of any church in the union.

Arr. 4 The association when convened shall be governed by a regular and proper decorum.

ART. 5 The association shall have a Moderator and assistant, a Clerk and assistant, who shall be chosen by the suffrages of the members present.

ART. 6 New churches shall be admitted into our union who shall petition by letter and delegate, and if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the association and manifested by the Moderator giving the hand of fellowship.

ART 7 Every church in the union shall philled to representation in the association.

ART. 8 Every query presented by any chure to the association being first debated in their own church, shall be taken up by the association.

ART. 9 Every motion made and seconded shall be taken up by the association, except it be with-

drawn by the member who made it.

ART. 10 The association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with the minutes of the association.

ART. 11 The churches shall send money by the delegates of each church to pay for printing the minutes of the association.

ART. 12 There shall be a record book kept wherein the proceedings of each association shall be regularly recorded by a Secretary appointed for that purpose.

ART, 13 The minutes of the association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the association rises. ART. 14 Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the union when they may deem it

necessary. ART. 15 All matters coming before the association shall be decided by the will of the majority.

ART. 16 The association shall have power: 1-To provide for the general union of the churches; 3-To preserve inviolably a chain of communication among the churches; 3-To give e churches all necessary advice in matters of fficulty; 4-To inquire into the cause why the the fail at any time to represent themselve the association; 5-To appoint any member or nembers by and with their consent to transact opsiness which they may think necessary; withdraw from any church in this union shall violate the rules of this association deriate from the orthodox principles of religion, admit any orderly minister of our order to a seat with us in the association; 8-To adjourn to any future time and place most convenient to the church or union; 9-No minister shall be ordained unless forwarded by a church and it shall require two or me ordained ministers to compose a presbyte for that purpose.

# ARTICLES OF FAITH

We, the churches of Jesus Christ, of Regular Baptists, are compituted on the following faith, viz:

ARTICLE 1 We believe in one only true and living God, the Creator of the heavens and the earth and all things that are therein contained.

ART. 2 We believe in Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, who is Head and King of His church.

ART. 3. We believe in the Holy Ghost, the Sealer and Applier of the redemption purchased by Christ.

ART. 4 We believe in the Father, Son and

Holy Ghost, and these three are one.

ART. 5 We believe in the scriptures of the Old and New Testament to be the infalible wor of God, take it for our only rule of faith a: practice, and nothing is to be added to it or take from it.

ART. 6 We believe in the free atonement & Jesus Christ, and that He tasted death for man and that salvation is offered to all me women upon the terms of the gospel.

ART. 7 We believe that repentance an in the Lord Jesus Christ are necessary pr to baptism and that immersion is the only way of administering the ordinance.

ART. 8 We believe that Christ has but one true gospel church and that it will finally perse-

vere through grace to glory.

ART. 9 We believe in the communion of the Lord's Supper, that is the taking of the bread and wine by the church of Jesus Christ in commemoration of the death and suffering of the Son of God until His second coming,

ART. 102 We believe that feet washing is an ordinance of Jesus Christ and ought to be observed and kept up by His church until His second coming.

ART. II We believe that Jesus Christ is the first resurrection from the dead and that He

lives forever.

ART. 12 We believe in the resurrection of the

just and unjust.

ART. 13 We believe in the final punishment of the wicked and in the eternal happiness of the righteous.

# RULES OF DECORUM

ARTICLE I The association shall be opened d closed by prayer."

ART. 2 A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosby the suffrage of the members present.

ART. 3. Only one member shall speak at the ne time who shall rise from his seat and adthe Mod ator when he is about to make

his speech.

ART. 4 The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech, except by the Modera-tor, till he is done speaking and shall strictly adhere to the surject and in nowise reflect on the person who spoke before or make remarks on his apparant failers and imperfections, but shall perily state the cause and matter as nearly as he an, so as to convey his light or idea.

ART. 5 No person shall rise and speak more

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than three times on one subject without liberty obtained from the association.

ART. 6 No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the association without liberty obtained from it.

ART. 7 No member of the association shall have the liberty of laughing curing the sitting cfl same, nor whispering in time of public speech.

ART. 8 No member of the association shall address another by any other title or appellation than that of brother.

ART. 9 The Moderator shall not interrupt a member until he gives his idea upon the subject except he breaks the rules of decorum.

association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as often as the association requires.

ART. II The Moderator shall have the same privilege of speech as another member, provide the chair be filled, but shall have no vote unless the association be equally divided.

ART. 12 Any member who shall willfully and knowingly break any of the rules shall be reproved by the association as it may think proper.

ART. 13 But three members shall take a seat in the association from each church.

ART. 14 No person shall speak more than five minutes at the same time without liberty obtained from the association.

ART. 15 These rules of decorum shall be read by the clerk at the commencement of every association.
