### FRIDAY September 12, 2003

The Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist, the Church of Jesus Christ, assembled in the Business Room of the Sardis Association Building at 180 Brushy School Road, Varney, Pike County, Kentucky, with our host, the Buck Creek Church, on Friday before the second Saturday in September, 2003.

About the hour of 9:00 a.m. our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the Stand and welcomed the congregation. Brother Tommy said, "one more year the Lord has blessed us to live." We need to let the Lord lead us. If you let the man on the outside lead you this is what gets you in trouble. I trust you will respect this office as of one having authority over you. What a great body this Old Baptist family is. What a wonderful group. We should respect this old Association and respect ourselves.

Elder Danny Runyon came in the opening, having been chosen last year as alternate for this years Introductory Sermon. Brother Danny stated, I hope what I might say will be to the upbuilding of God's Kingdom. We need one another and need to take care of one another. We need to treat one another right. He then sang, "Lord, You're The Best Thing". He said the Lord is the best thing that ever happened to him. To every nation, kindred and tongue and people, saying with a loud voice fear God, and give glory to him. God said he would call his people from the four corners of the world. If you haven't got Jesus in you today, pour out your heart to him today. If you are luke warm, he will spit you out. How we treat one another has an effect on your family. We need to work through the love and kindness of Jesus. I hope I have been good to you. He said this morning he thought about the good old brothers who helped lead us. I urge you to reach out and take the hand of the Lord. Let the Lord lead you. If we come in the right way, God will lead us. Let's work in a way in that morning we can say, come welcome death. If we go like the three Hebrew brothers, he will lead us out like he did them. If you want to go to Heaven, God has got a place for you. Jesus said me and my father will come in and go no more out. Even the winds obey him. When you trust in the Lord things will work out. God is reaching out, he is reaching out today. He said for I am God and beside me there is no other. When God's Spirit comes around, you won't need a brother to tell you about it. The whole duty of man is to glorify God and keep his commandments. How great that Spirit is.

Brother Danny then led in prayer.

Elder Dale Williamson came to preach the Introductory Sermon stating that it's with a heart full of love that I come before you. It's a great honor to come before you. I have started on a journey. The people of God are going somewhere when this life is over. I want to walk the street of gold. God is everly with his people. Ask from the heart. Our prays are not always answered, sometimes we are told to be patient. He hung upon the cross for us. I believe God's people can see things. When God comes in your life people can see the difference. Believe that he is and that he is a rewarder of them that dilligently seek him. God can bring strength out of weakness. The Sardis Association delegates and a large delegation from our Corresponding Sister Associations remained in the Business Room for the Work of this Association and, as is our custom, the many non-delegate Brethren, Sisters and friends were dismissed to assemble in the Preaching Room to hear the preaching of:

The delegates having assembled themselves in order, Elder Thomas J. Dials, our Moderator, called to seats the delegates from our Churches sent to represent them in this Association and the delegates sent by our Corresponding Sister Associations.

Brother Tommy called upon Elder Ellis Holbrook, of the New Salem Association, to open these services. Brother Ellis came forth and stated that it is in much weakness that I approach you and in much, much fear. Fear not man which is able to destroy this body but fear God who can destroy both soul and body. There is one mediator between God and man. I begin to see the Rock hewed right out of the mountain. I hope I may lift up my eyes and look unto the Lord. Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of the Lord. How shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? How shall they hear without a preacher? How shall they preach lest they be sent? John was in the Isle of Patmos, for the Word of God, and for the testimony of Jesus Christ. God showed him many things. He showed him a angel flying in the mist of Heaven. Every brother God has called will be a witness to that angel. Condemnation has come in this world. All have sinned and come short of the glory of God.

Elder Danny Hurley, of the Old Friendship Association, led in prayer.

The Sardis Association then proceeded as follows:

- (1) Our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the stand and said, "my job is to keep the rules of decorum and to keep order; you delegates need to support me." He then asked the delegates to appoint Brother Ralph W. E. Varney, Jr. to serve as Assistant Clerk until a new Assistant Clerk is elected. Motion by Brother Jim Cochran and second by Brother Ron Knox to appoint Brother Ralph to serve.
- (2) The Moderator appointed a Committee on Finance to receive contributions sent to the Association by the several Churches as follows:

- (3) The Moderator called for the Letters from the Sardis Association Churches to be handed in to the Clerk and for the contributions to be handed in to the Committee on Finance.
- (4) Having reviewed the Letters received from the Churches for regular form and order, the Letter from the Buck Creek Church was read. The Moderator advised the delegates that since the Sardis Church has written a letter stating they cannot abide by Item 7 of the 2002 minutes of the Sardis Association to refer the Sardis Church Letter to the Committee on Arrangements. Also, the Elk Fork Church Letter should be referred to the Committee on Arrangements since the Moderator is the same at both these Churches. Motion by Elder Bobby Scott, Sr. and second by Elder Wallace Muncy to receive all the letters, seat the delegates and refer the Sardis Church and the Elk Fork Church Letters and the Queries and Request to the Committee on Arrangements.
- (5) The Committee on Finance reported \$4,820.00 received from the Churches as reported in the Statistical Table, less money returned to the Elk Fork delegate and after turning this amount over to the Treasurer was discharged, by regular move and second.
- (6) The Moderator appointed a Committee to arrange the preaching for Friday night and Saturday consisting of one delegate from each Church in the Sardis Association, and the entire delegation from the host church.
- (7) The Moderator appointed the following Committee of Tellers to take the vote of the Sardis Association delegates for Officers to serve the Sardis Association for the coming year and instructed the delegates to vote for a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk:

- (14) The Moderator called for newly organized Churches or other Churches of our same faith and order desiring to take up correspondence with the Sardis Association, and for Associations desiring to take up correspondence with the Sardis Association and none responded.
- (15) The Moderator appointed a Committee on Arrangements consisting of one delegate from each Church and all the Officers of the Sardis Association, along with the entire delegation from each of our Corresponding Sister Associations, to arrange the business for Saturday's session of the Sardis Association. By regular move and second, this Committee will meet at 3:00 p.m. today.
- (16) On motion from Elder Chester Cochran, second by Brother Ron Knox, the Sardis Association was adjourned until 9:00 a.m. Saturday morning, September 13, 2003.

### **SATURDAY**

### September 13, 2003

Met pursuant to adjournment at the Sardis Association Building where, about the hour of 9:00 a.m., our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the stand and stated that he was thankful that all had come out to this One Hundred and Eleventh Session of the Sardis Association. He said we are glad you could be here. It's a blessing to serve you. He said during the week he had asked the Lord to be with us. We need to work in love and peace. We need to protect this old time way. We need to uphold this old time way. And when we do this stand upon the Rock. I hope you come to worship the Lord. This should be a worship service. We love each other so much. He then called upon Elder Hillard Newsome of the Northern New Salem Association to open these services.

Brother Hillard came to the stand feeling like Brother Tommy had made a mistake. He said he feels so little. He said, look unto the Lord. If you don't have life come to him. He will give you everything you need. Come to the Lord. He is a burden barrier. He is our King this morning. He said one day he was told to let his light shine. Talk to the Lord this morning. When my burdens get heavy I find him there. I love this family this morning. Love one another. If you talk about your Brother, shame on you. When I had nothing he made me rich. Elder Roger Hicks of the New Salem Association led in prayer.

The Sardis Association then proceeded as follows:

- (1) Called the roll of delegates and marked the absentees. At this time the Moderator released the Brethren, Sisters and friends to assemble in the Preaching room.
- (2) Read the Bill of Arrangements and, by move and second, received the report and discharged the Committee on Arrangements.
- (3) Read the letter from the Sardis Church dated May 5, 2003 which stated that the Sardis Church cannot abide with Item 7 of the 2002 minutes of the Sardis Association. After discussion, motion by Elder Bobby Scott, Sr. and second by Elder Chester Cochran that because of their decision to not abide by the Orders of the Sardis Association to withdraw fellowship from the Sardis Church and to make a way for any member who wants to remain in the Sardis Association to do so, and to be able to go to any of our churches by recommendation.

The Moderator advised the Brethren from the Sardis Church that if they agreed to abide by the Orders of the Sardis Association they could came back to the Sardis Association if they come back through the proper channels.

(4) The Moderator explained that after the meeting of the Committee on Arrangement on Friday the delegate from the Elk Fork Church had picked up the Elk Fork Letter of Correspondence and the money the Elk Fork Church had sent. Motion by Brother Ron Knox and second by Elder Chester Cochran, that because of Elder Frank Sheppard's actions, to declare the Elk Fork Church in non fellowship and send a Committee with the authority to question the Elk Fork Church members on obeying the Sardis Association Orders, to give the Committee the power to report back to the Association with no open discussion on the Association floor and to make a way for any member of the Elk Fork Church to remain in the Sardis Association.

Also, give this Committee the authority to ask the Elk Fork Church if they want to remain in the Association and to remove any element that may prevent this from happening. The Moderator appointed:

(5) The Committee appointed to see why the Muncy Valley Church did not letter up in 2002 reported that the Muncy Valley Church gave the reasons listed in the letter to our last Association as the reason for their leaving. The letter reads as follows:

We the Church of Jesus Christ of Old Regular Baptist called Muncy Valley met in regular session on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in August. Elder James Stumbo made a motion to not letter up with the Sardis Association this time. Brother Paul Coleman seconded the motion. There was no objection. We feel we are trapped in a situation with no way to have our differences heard, due to last years actions of the Association. We were denied the right to be heard. It seemed as if no one really cared. We feel that these actions caused the association to violate their own rules. We feel that the association does not show much love for our church. The churches won't visit with us. We get in trouble anytime we allow anyone outside our correspondence to come and worship with us. We do not believe that the Regular Baptists are the only people going to heaven. It seems as though the association is more concerned with tradition, in many ways than with the commandments of God

Mark 7:8 For laying aside the commandment of God, ye hold the tradition of men.

One example of this is the use of the word Pastor. It offends many of our brothers, yet it is the biblical term used for the overseer of the church. We are just so far apart on several issues and the association has denied us the right to reason together. We are leaving in peace, hoping that someday the association can come together in peace with all of the churches. We believe that it is important for the Muncy Valley Church to be led by the Spirit.

Romans 8:14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, They are the Sons of God. We cannot be led by the Spirit and follow the rules of the association.

II Corinthians 3:17 Now the Lord is that Spirit and where the Spirit of the Lord is there is liberty.

We have no liberty in the Association. We pray and trust that our actions in this matter do not offend the Association any more. We don't want any harsh feelings. We only want peace. We love each and every one of our brothers and sisters and we trust that you feel the same toward us, and that you will still come and worship with us. We feel that if our differences are heard that it will just cause more problems in the association and that is not our goal. Dear Brothers and Sisters pray for us and come visit us. Done by the order of the Muncy Valley Church.

Regular move and second to receive the report, to declare that the Muncy Valley Church remain in non fellowship and discharge the Committee.

(6) Read the Request from the Little Rosie Church asking the Association to give the Trustees of the Association the authority to sign over ownership of the present Little Rosie Church property to the Church so it can be sold since the Little Rosie Church wants to move back home where they used to be. Motion by Brother Eddie Marcum and second by Brother Jim Cochran to grant the Request and that they take the money and use it.

- (7) Read the Request from the Little Rosie Church concerning plans for showers for the campers. Motion by Brother Jim Cochran and second by Elder Chester Cochran to acknowledge the Request and to check on the cost and bring it back to the Association.
- (8) Read the Request from the Apple Orchard Church asking that baby's and small children's obituaries be put in the first of the obituaries and not in the friends of the church. Motion by Elder Chester Cochran and second by Brother Alex Hensley to grant the Request.
- (9) Appointed a Committee of Tellers to take the vote of the Sardis Association delegates as to who shall preach the Introductory Sermon at our year 2004 Association and who shall be his alternate:

- (11) A Request came through the Clerk from the family of Sister Minnie Gilman to print her obituary in the 2003 Minutes of the Sardis Association. By regular move and second it is ordered that this obituary be printed.
- (12) Read a Request from the Turkey Creek Church (Pilgrims Rest Church Request, very similar to the Turkey Creek Request, was acknowledged but not read) asking the Association to print an ordinance in our minute book, stating that the view of a <u>sanctioned marriage of God is between a man and woman only</u>. As set forth in Saint Mark Chapter 10, verse 6, 7 and 8 which reads:

Verse 6: But from the beginning of the creation God made them male and female

Verse 7: For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother and cleave to his wife

Verse 8: And they twain shall be one flesh; so then they are no more twain but on flesh.

Additionally in Ephesians Chapter 5, Verses 22, 23 and 28 it reads:

Verse 22: Wives, submit yourselves unto your husbands, as unto the Lord

Verse 23: For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the Church: and he is the Savior of the body.

Verse 28: So ought men to love their wives, as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself.

By regular move and second the Request was granted and it is ordered that this be printed in the Minute.

- (14) Read the Request from the Samaria Church asking that the name of Thomas Jason May be removed from the list of ordained ministers and the name of Rayburn May be removed from the list of liberated brothers. By regular move and second the Request was granted.
- (15) By regular move and second, it was ordered that the Clerk be appointed Secretary-Treasurer for 2003 and that he be allowed \$50.00 for his expense.
- (16) Received the report of the Building Committee and, by regular move and second, ordered it be discharged and the Moderator appoint a new Building Committee to be responsible for all use, repair, improvements, maintenance and preservation of the property as follows:

### STANDING ITEMS

**Item 1**. Item 14 of our 1975 Minutes is reprinted, without the preamble, as follows:

Sardis Association of Old Regular Baptist

September 13, 1975 Dingess, West Virginia

Brethren:

In answer to the Query from the Dix Fork Church asking, "Does the Sardis Association believe in Sisters wearing pants, slacks or shorts?" We, as an Advisory body, say:

To answer this query in the affirmative would be interpreted by some Brethren too liberally and they would say we have laid down the gate and opened the doors to anything and everything.

To answer this Query in the negative would be interpreted by some Brethren too strictly and they would say we have shut the door on everything and Committees would flow from Church to Church like water. We believe the Sardis Association should advise the Churches to advise their members, both Brethren and Sisters, to dress soberly and modestly and to conduct themselves in a manner that becometh a Child of God. We believe that each Child of God will adorn themselves in a manner that they can easily be identified from the world. We feel the Bible, the infallible Word of God, sets forth and the Spirit will teach us how we should dress and conduct ourselves.

We believe, and the Association has so stated in the past, that each Church in the Sardis Association holds the key to its own door and is the sole judge of the conduct of its members as long as they follow the orthodox principles of religion and keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel as laid down in the Scriptures. In fact, Article 3 of our Constitution guarantees that the Association shall not infringe on any internal right of the Churches.

- **Item 2.** The Association, by regular move and second, said that if a Sister has cut her hair, she should be asked to let it grow out; if she fails to do so and cuts her hair again, she will be excluded.

- **Item 4.** It is ordered that we advise our Churches not to allow their Ministers to preach with any Minister who has two living women. (1919 minute)
- Item 5. It is ordered that requests for Union, Communion and Memorial meetings be published in our Minutes.

Item 6. By motion and second, it is ordered that Obituaries of our deceased Brethren and Sisters that are in good standing with the Churches at the time of death be printed in our Minutes. Also, friends of the Churches that are recommended by the Churches be printed in a separate section of our minute. These are to be presented to the Clerk at the end of the Association. A charge of \$15.00 will be made for a picture with the obituary, except that pictures of an Elder or his wife will continue to be printed free.

Clerks Note: Please note the above order - it is incumbent upon the churches in the Sardis Association that they be the screen and recommending body of Obituaries of Friends to be printed in our minutes and identify the same (by note or otherwise) to the Clerks when the Obituary is turned in. Each Church Moderator is further required to screen and approve any Obituary of a Friend of the Church and to reject any Obituary that has language that is offensive to the Sardis Association.

Item 7. "We the Sardis Association, advise our Sister Churches that it is not our practice to use sisters or double-married men in any function of the ministry, including leading prayer, in any of our Church services."

Item 8. By regular move and second, it is ordered that Item (15) of our 1999 Minute be reprinted as follows:

"It is a sin for anyone to put away their wife or husband for any cause except for fornication and marry another. In regards to going behind one's experience or receiving one in the Church with more than one living companion, we say that each Church shall be the sole judge to the validity of one's experience. Churches should not be forced to receive members, however, that would destroy the body. (Receive should be interpreted to include all means of receiving members.)"

### **SUNDAY**

### **September 14, 2003**

About the hour of 10:00 a.m. our Moderator, Elder Thomas J. Dials, came to the stand to announce the arrangements stating, God has always got food available to us. If you were here you would have been able to feel that good Spirit that was with us. You would have been able to have that good feeling. Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for Brethren to dwell together in unity! It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard: that went down to the shirts of his garment: as the dew of Hermon and as the dew that descended upon the mountains of Zion: for there the Lord commanded the blessing, even life for evermore. God has blessed the Sardis Association this weekend. Behold, bless ye the Lord. Lift up your hands and bless the Lord that made Heaven. The children of God will bless him and give him praise. There is nothing that could prevent us from doing that.

Elder James Tackett, of the New Salem Association, came to the stand very humble. He said, God has been very good to us. They that trust in the Lord shall be as mount Zion, which cannot be removed, but abideth for ever. As the mountains are round about Jerusalem, so the Lord is round about his people from henceforth even forever. God don't just walk off and leave us, he will make a way for us. If you don't believe in prayers you should have been here. When Mary and Martha were in trouble and weeping Jesus began to weep. Every step Jesus took was leading him to Calvary's cross. Jesus was upon the mountain. O Jerusalem, Jerusalem which killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee; how often would I have gathered thy children together, as a hen doth gather her brood under her wings, and ye would not! As the mount is round about Jerusalem, so is the Lord round about us here. The Bible says: For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. When Jesus was going through the land, going to Jericho people began to follow him. And, behold, two blind men sitting by the way side, when they heard that Jesus had passed by, cried out, saying, Have mercy on us, O Lord, thou son of David. The Lord is passing this way. I cried out Jesus have mercy on me. Can you remember crying out Jesus have mercy on me. I am glad he is around about us. I am glad to stand before you and to declare his name.

Elder Monroe Jones, of the New Salem Association, followed him stating it is a great blessing to meet with the brothers. Pray for me. If I knew what I was going to say it wouldn't be by revelation. If there is a sinner man or woman in the house, I pray God will bless you. I believe God calls his servants and they have different gifts, but all have the same calling. He calls sinners to repentance. There are two men in this race. Both men have to have that bread and water to live. When I was seven years old I heard a brother quote a scripture and I can still remember that scripture. The hour commeth, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live. When I was a child my mom set me at the root of a tree and I listened to that preacher and wondered how a man in a grave could hear. There are two men in the race. I have everly preached the Church and the world. The world is sinner man and sinner women. This boy here was on earth twelve or twelve and one half years before I come into the world. When the light of God's Spirit came into me, the inner man died in trespass and sin. Repentance is required at the hands of all men. If sons and daughters ever repent they must take heed to God's teachings. The Church is a congregation of faithful believers baptized upon a profession of faith. If they are baptized with the Holy Ghost and fire, they are in God's Kingdom. I am the water from Heaven that a man may drink thereof and never thirst. When the inward man eats of that bread and drinks of that water he will never die. When light came in your life and brought condemnation that soul died in trespass and sin. You must have faith.

I received faith when condemnation come to that man. First of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks. If a man die, shall he live again? Just as sure as the inward man eats of that bread and drinks of that water he will live again. The inward man receives hope. Jesus is that hope. That inward man can't die anymore. I have everly preached it to be a Baptist church. He sent John the Baptist. There is one way to Heaven; Jesus said, I am the way. I have never asked no man or woman to join the Church. I talk to sons and daughters and tell them this man is going back to the earth. Anything the Bible supports is not false doctrine. For Heaven's sake don't leave an impression that will down our sons and daughters confidence in us. If you eat of the bread and drink of that water the inner man is alive. Jesus said I am the resurrection. Look unto me for I am God and beside me there is none other. It takes a new birth in God to make a Baptist. Baptist are whats going to Heaven.

Elder Buddy W. Carty, of the Northern New Salem Association came next. I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek, For there in is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith, as it is written, The just shall live by faith. Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. I love Jesus today. He is revealed to us by his Spirit. Our children have the same opportunity we had. John came preaching in the wilderness saying, repent ye, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. Man is responsible. When He calls a man to preach he can't blame his wife for this and that. He has to take responsibility for what he does. It is his fault if he adds to it or takes away from it. The Bible says a woman might forsake suckling babe but the Lord will never leave or forsake you. Herod set out to kill all the male children two years old and younger to get Jesus. When God sees fit to preserve this old family, it will be here. God will find faith when he comes back again. The old sainted mothers can pray and ask prayer for me to preach the truth in Christ Jesus. What is there to preach except Jesus and him crucified. There is no other way to be saved except through Jesus. The wise men were told he was going to be born and laid in a manger. I being in the way the Lord led me to the house of my masters brother. I am seeking Heaven today. God can't lie and he saved me. He took the ground and molded it into a man and breathed into his nostrils and he became a living soul. There are two men in the race. They are not turned loose and one go one way and one go the other way. David said, I cried mighty unto the Lord. God gave me a promise. He did not leave me alone. He guides me in this land. When the mother took her baby and wrapped him and put him in the brook, God was right there. God has been here, that is why we had a good Association. Where the Lord is there is peace. There are times God predestinates things. This is the way he had to preserve his people. Fear not man who can destroy this body but fear God who can destroy both soul and body. God holds all power in Heaven and on earth. Lady came and wanted to know if she could go get the baby's mother. Our mother today is Mother Jerusalem. If you don't get what you want it is not mother s fault. The mother came and took care of her baby. Anyone who has had their robe washed white by the blood of the lamb is a little baby. When Moses grew up he chose rather to suffer. We don't tell God to do things, we ask God to do things. He chose rather to suffer the persecutions. Have you got tired of suffering today? I thank God he lifted my feet from the mire and the clay. I want to preach the truth in Christ Jesus. The spirit told me I was already a sinner. You must choose to suffer as a child of God. He has a long white robe for us, made white in the blood of the Lamb. You must bear the cross to wear the crown. God don't persecute us for serving him. He said, let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your father which is in Heaven. When out in sin many told me they were Christians. I was not interested. I distinguished a child of God by their eyes. If they showed me love I felt they must be a good person. Let your light so shine that others might see. Let your light shine to the world that they might see. Let your light so shine before men that they might see your good work. The spirit will make you walk and talk different.

The life that I live is not mine, it belongs to the Lord. It's for me to tell you how good the Lord is today. Life is serious today. Jesus took unto himself a body of flesh for the suffering of man. Jesus came walking by the blinded boy and he cried out. Brother Buddy told of his youngest son calling him when he got in trouble for his sins. God is no respecter of person. Brother Buddy preached that nothing he ever did that caused the Lord to save him. It's not work of righteousness. When God began to work with me I had no righteousness, I was lost. For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is a gift of God. God has everly been there, you must deny yourself. Your own righteousness must become as nought. Our righteousness is as filthy rags. Respect comes from the fear of God. Paul said, When I preached the gospel to you at first and my temptation which was in my flesh ye despised not, nor rejected but would have plucked your eyes out and gave them to me, now that I tell you the truth, you seek my life. Paul, said of the thing that gave me trouble, God delivered me. The Bible says don't settle down on anything short of the saving grace of God. I hope I have not said anything that would cause you to do that. Let us live the best we can and it still will be bad enough.

Elder Hobart Hamilton, our Assistant Moderator, came to the stand saying, I am happy to be one of you. I am happy to be here to tell you about Jesus Christ. God heard our prayers and came to help us yesterday. I am thankful that the Spirit of the Lord is here today. When we get in trouble we begin to call for prayer. Peter was put in prison for preaching what we preach today: that being Christ Jesus. God sent an angel down in the dark dungeon and said unto Peter put on thy sandals and the angel led him out. One day God's Spirit came along and made me realize I had nothing in this world. I'm sorry today that I only have one life to give to Jesus for all he has done for me. Cry from the heart, you need help to repent. You need Christ to help you. One time another man was in trouble, Christ came to him and he came from the tomb of the dead and cried aloud. He was able to go where Jesus was. Your prayers can reach the son of God. We love God and we love his son. In the spirit we would be willing to die for one another. If you want the Lord, he is available. He did not die in vain. Jesus died for you. Jesus died that man might live. I had a burden that I didn't like. God let me understand that through Christ Jesus a mountain of sin could be removed. If you are in sin you are blessed if you can call an old preacher and asked him questions. If you don't know the Lord in the pardon and remission of your sin, don't let the sun go down before you pray to the Lord. One day God came along and lifted a burden from my soul. There is something to this old church. You are a servant of God forever. How wonderful the Lord is.

Elder Thomas J. Dials, our Moderator, came forward declaring we have had a drought in our Association. Through our trouble we realize that we have had someone to go to, to ask for help. I ask the Lord to help me. We are blessed because the Lord is with us. We have worked together and we have worked with love. When we are in Jesus, we are something; we are different. We must call upon him. Our meetings have been real spiritual. The Lord is that Rock, the stone the builder rejected. Get anchored in that Rock. The farther you go down that road, the farther you must come back. We are going home, Jesus is coming again. Jesus went and made a way. I've got my eyes set on a home. He has a Kingdom already set up. The place has been prepared. There came a time in my life at the New Salem Association an old preacher name Kirby Isom preached to me, "stay out of the oat field". I went outside to get away from the sound that was touching me, but could hear the sound outside. That is when I began to change. The three boys were put in the furnace for not obeying the King. There is a sound in this. My sheep hear my voice, the voice of a stranger they will not obey them. He has been with us and blessed us. He will bless us if we keep the good old way.


# OBITUARIES of BRETHREN AND SISTERS


### ELDER BERLIN THORNSBURY

Also two dear sisters and brothers-in-law, Joe and Ledna Parsons and Ruth Maynard of Varney, KY and a host of family and friends.




and neighbors. Paul was a school teacher, principal, and a school bus driver until he retired.


#### **OLIVER GENE STANLEY**

## CONSTITUTION OF THE SARDIS ASSOCIATION

From a long series of experiences we, the OLD REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST, being baptized upon a profession of faith in Christ are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Churches in order to perpetuate a union and communion among us and to keep the order and rules of an Association according to the following plan of government.

- **ARTICLE 1.** The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different Churches in our union and sent to represent them in the Association and, upon their producing Letters from their respective Churches certifying their appointment, they shall be entitled to a seat.
- **ARTICLE 2**. In the Letters shall be expressed their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by Letter, dismissed, excluded, and deceased since our last Association.
- **ARTICLE 3.** The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord anything over God's heritage nor shall they have any clerical power over the Churches nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any Church in the Union.
- **ARTICLE 4**. The Association when convened shall be ruled by a regular and proper decorum.
- **ARTICLE 5**. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- **ARTICLE 6.** New Churches may be admitted to this union who shall petition by Letter and delegates and, if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly, shall be received; and every Church in the union shall be entitled to a representative in the Association.
- **ARTICLE 7**. Every query presented by the Church to the Association, being first debated in their own Churches, shall be taken up by the Association.
- **ARTICLE 8**. Every motion made and seconded shall come under consideration of the Association, except when withdrawn by the one who made it.
- **ARTICLE 9.** The Association shall endeavor to furnish the Churches with Minutes of the Association.
- **ARTICLE 10.** We think it necessary that we should have an Association Fund for defraying the expenses of the same. We think it the duty of each Church in the union to contribute such sums as they think proper and to send it by their delegates to the Association; and such sums be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer chosen by the Association who shall be accountable for the money paid him by the Association, and paid out according to the Association.
- **ARTICLE 11**. There shall be an Association book kept wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be recorded by a Secretary appointed by the Association who shall receive a compensation for his services.
- **ARTICLE 12**. The minutes of the Association shall be read, and corrected if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises, unless the same is dispensed with.
- **ARTICLE 13.** Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made by a majority of the union, if deemed necessary.
- **ARTICLE 14.** All matters coming before the Association shall be decided by the will of the majority of the delegates present.

ARTICLE 15. The Association shall have the power to provide for the general union of the Churches; to preserve inviolable a chain of communion among the Churches; to give Churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause of the Churches failing to represent themselves at any time in the Association; to appropriate the money contributed by the Churches for the Association fund to any purpose they may think proper; to appoint any member, by their consent, to transact any business which they see necessary; and they shall have the power to withdraw from any Church in the union which violates the rules of the Association or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion; and to admit any orderly Minister of our order to seat with us. The Association shall have the right to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the Churches.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

#### **OF THE**

#### SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- **ARTICLE 1**. We believe in only one true and living God; the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost; and these three are one, equal in power, essence and glory.
- **ARTICLE 2**. We believe the scripture of the Old and New Testaments of the Authorized King James Version of the Bible are the written words of God and are the only rules of faith and practice.
- ARTICLE 3. We believe in the doctrine of election by grace, for by grace are ye saved through faith.
- **ARTICLE 4.** We believe in the doctrine of original sin and of man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, therefore the Saviour is needed for our redemption.
- **ARTICLE 5.** We believe that sinners are called to repentance and believe in the Gospel and regeneration of the soul and sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, and none shall fall away and be lost.
- **ARTICLE 6**. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- **ARTICLE 7**. We believe that baptism is the ordinance of God's Church on earth and the mode IMMERSION, back foremost, so as to cover all over.
- **ARTICLE 8**. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the command of the Saviour, and that by use of bread and the fruit of the vine, and feet washing should be kept up until his second coming by his believers.
- **ARTICLE 9.** We believe in the resurrection of the dead, both of the just and the unjust, and that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal.
- **ARTICLE 10**. We believe that no Minister has the right to administer the ordinances and commands of the Gospel except such as are regularly ordained and baptized, and that by immersion by a legal administrator of the Gospel comes under the hands of a regularly chosen presbytery of the Church.
- **ARTICLE 11**. We believe it to be the duty of all Church members to contribute for defraying all reasonable expenses of the Church, never forgetting the poor according to their several abilities.
- **ARTICLE 12.** We believe that every doctrine that goes to encourage or indulge people in their sins or cause them to settle down on anything short of saving faith in Christ for salvation is erroneous, and such doctrine shall be rejected by us.
- **ARTICLE 13**. We believe that the Church of Jesus Christ is a congregation of faithful believers in Christ who have obtained fellowship with the Lord and one another, and have given themselves to the Lord and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline according to the rules of the Gospel.

- **ARTICLE 14**. We believe that Jesus Christ is the head of the Church and the government thereof is upon His Shoulders.
- **ARTICLE 15**. None of the above Articles shall be considered as to hold with particular election and reprobation so as to make God partial, directly or indirectly, nor to injure any of the children of men, nor shall any of those Articles be altered without legal notice and free consent.

#### RULES OF DECORUM

#### OF THE

#### SARDIS ASSOCIATION

- **ARTICLE 1**. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- **ARTICLE 2**. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk each chosen separately by a majority vote of the delegates present.
- **ARTICLE 3**. Only one member shall speak at a time who shall arise from his seat and obtain consent from the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- **ARTICLE 4**. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator until he is through.
- **ARTICLE 5**. He shall strictly adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the person who has spoken so as make remarks on his slips or imperfections, but shall fairly state the cause as nearly as he can so as to convey his ideas.
- **ARTICLE 6.** No person shall abruptly absent himself from the Association without leave of the Association.
- **ARTICLE** 7. No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association, and only five minutes at a time.
- **ARTICLE 8.** No person shall have the liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same nor whisper in time of public speech.
- **ARTICLE 9**. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term or appellation than that of "brother."
- **ARTICLE 10**. The Moderator shall not interrupt or prohibit any member from speaking until he gives his light on any subject unless he violates the Rules of Decorum.
- **ARTICLE 11**. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called as often as the Association requires.
- **ARTICLE 12.** The Moderator shall have the same right of speech as any other member, provided the chair be filled; and he shall have no right to vote unless the Association be equally divided, then he may give the deciding vote.
- **ARTICLE 13**. Any member who shall willingly and knowingly violate any of the Decorum shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.
